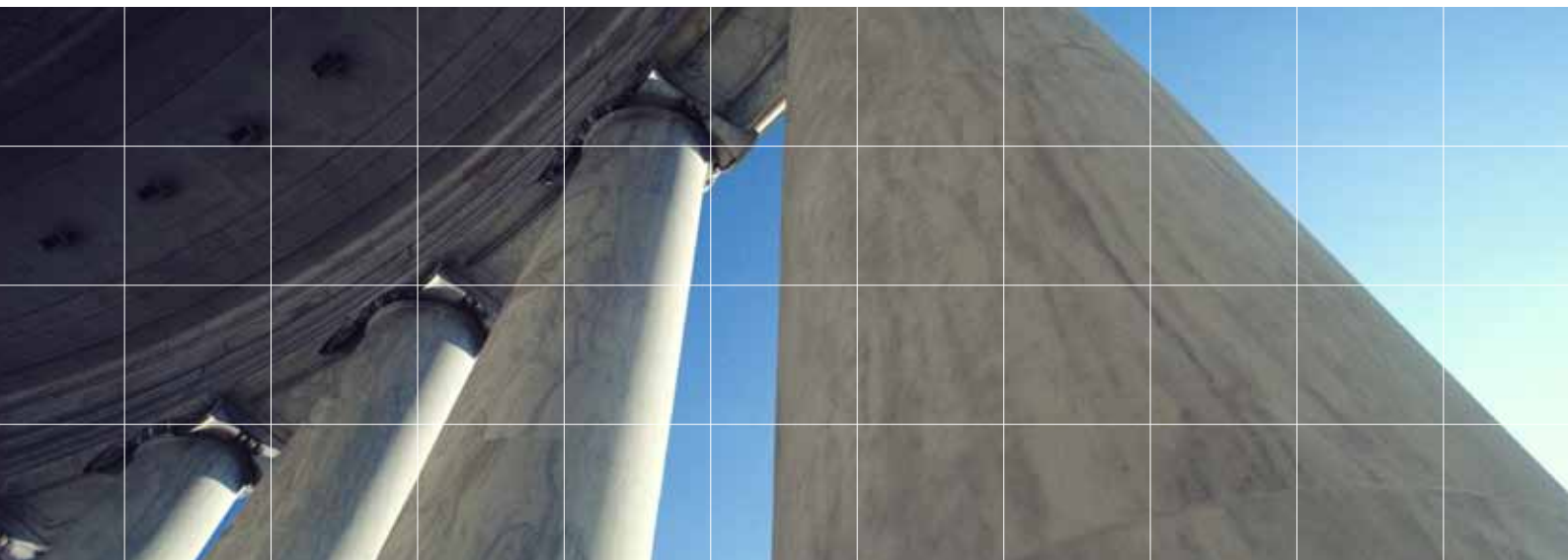

In close cooperation with colleagues and trusted local counsel who focus on court litigation, we advise and represent clients in any eventual actions before national courts to enforce or to set aside arbitral awards.

Our clients' international disputes have arisen from a broad spectrum of commercial activities and sectors, including the following:

- Construction and engineering (e.g., under FIDIC, CECA and ICE contracts).
- Joint venture agreements and M&A transactions.
- Energy, including oil and gas exploration, development and production, and electricity, including generation and transmission, power plants and pipelines.
- Telecommunications and information technology.
- License, management, distribution and franchise agreements (e.g., involving pharmaceuticals, luxury goods, leisure and hotels).
- Sale of goods (e.g., commodities, manufactured goods and industrial equipment).

Our experience goes beyond the representation of clients in dispute resolution proceedings. Members of the Firm's arbitration team are accredited mediators and serve as arbitrators in complex international arbitrations, and the team includes lawyers who have served as members and general counsel of the ICC International Court of Arbitration as well as counsel in the Secretariat of the ICC Court.

## INTERNATIONAL LITIGATION

The Jones Day litigation team includes lawyers based in each of Jones Day's European offices (except Milan and Moscow); they are admitted to practice before their state courts in all commercial and corporate matters that may arise for our clients. The team has established a network of trustworthy correspondents (local attorneys, experts, bailiffs) in order to provide any legal service that may be required, wherever it is required.

Our European litigators are part of a global practice that comprises more than 1,100 lawyers. Working closely with colleagues in other Jones Day offices—either in the Asia-Pacific region or the United States—we are able to handle matters that involve multiple jurisdictions. For example, litigation in the United States may give rise to ancillary procedures in one or more European countries. Proceedings to gather evidence, pursuant to U.S. rules of discovery or the Hague Convention on the Taking of Evidence Abroad in Civil or Commercial Matters, may be launched in Europe. The European affiliate of an Asian company may be party to a lawsuit before a U.S. court. A U.S. company or its European affiliate may become involved in a dispute with a European company before a European court. Our lawyers are thoroughly experienced in all of these situations, successfully representing clients and protecting their interests.
